- 50 000 Registered farmers

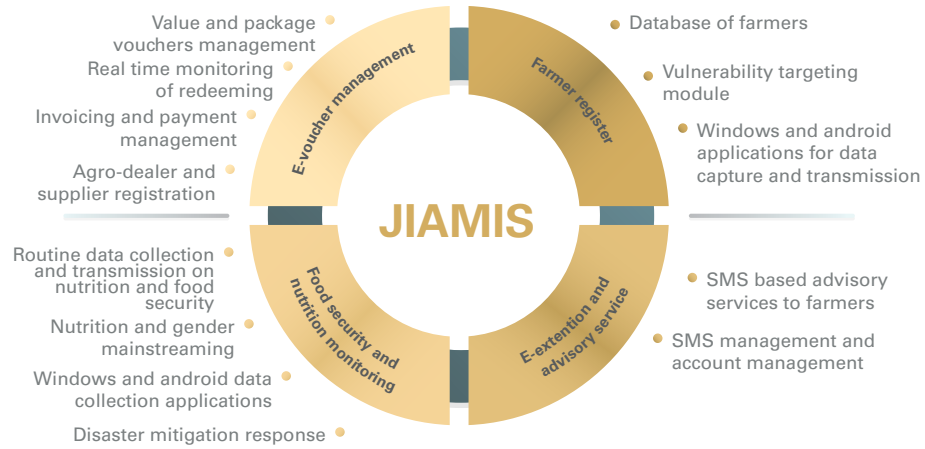
Targeting module

- 10 000 Vulnerable farmers registered based on socio-economic and food security vulnerability criteria

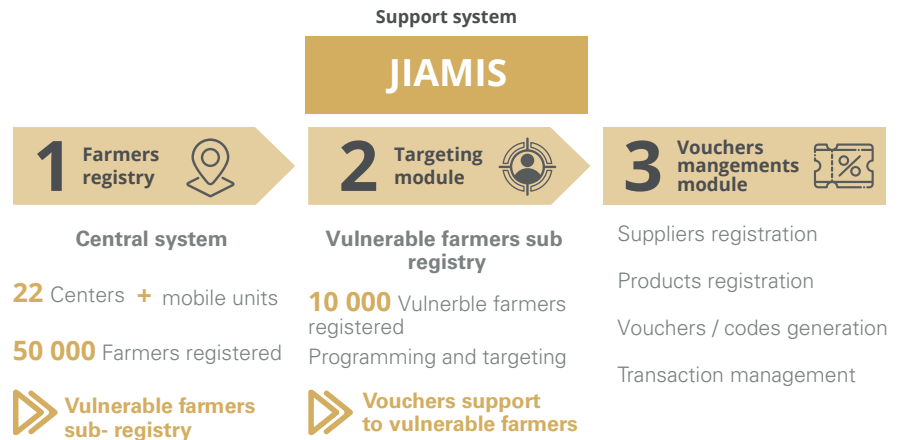
Vouchers management module
