Intensifying water constraints threaten food security and nutrition. Thus, urgent action is needed to make water use in agriculture more sustainable and equitable. Irrigated agriculture remains by far the largest user of freshwater, but scarcity of freshwater is a growing problem owing to increasing demand and competition for freshwater resources. At the same time, rainfed agriculture is facing increasing precipitation variability driven by climate change. These trends will exacerbate disputes among water users and inequality in access to water, especially for small-scale farmers, the rural poor and other vulnerable populations.

The State of Food and Agriculture 2020 presents new estimates on the pervasiveness of water scarcity in irrigated agriculture and of water shortages in rainfed agriculture, as well as on the number of people affected. It finds major differences across countries, and also substantial spatial variation within countries. This evidence informs a discussion of how countries may determine appropriate policies and

interventions, depending on the nature and magnitude of the problem, but also on other factors such as the type of agricultural production system and countries' level of development and their political structures. Based on this, the publication provides guidance on how countries can prioritize policies and interventions to overcome water constraints in agriculture, while ensuring efficient, sustainable and equitable access to water.



TAJIKISTAN







FROM MAPS TO DATABASES

LAUNCH OF THE FREEDOM FROM HUNGER AND THIRST INITIATIVE

As years went by, food problems in the developing world grew worse. The UN's food plan showed little sign of being effective in alleviating hunger, malnutrition, government (NGO) and private citizens worldwide. In 1974, the UN General Assembly, the International Union of Soil Science, and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) joined forces to launch a campaign. After five years of negotiations, the UN General Assembly adopted a resolution in 1980. Its audience was wide, from the UN to governments, to NGOs, to the public at large. At all, Government agreed that "the fight against hunger and thirst must be sustainable morally and socially, as well as ecologically, in order to meet the needs of the poor and the equity of opportunity to all, particularly the poor, in the social and environmental peace." The aim was to "achieve a sustainable and harmonious worldwide of the problems of food, agriculture, nutrition and health for more than half the world's population, which solutions could be organized on a global scale." The resolution was adopted.

MAPPING THE WORLD'S NATURE RESOURCES

High-quality seeds and fertilizer were only a part of the overall solution. The other part was the knowledge of soils, their properties and

It is affecting key sectors that contribute to food security, nutrition and livelihoods, including the livestock sector. The global community's ability to safeguard human, animal and environmental health is fundamental in preventing the next pandemic.

Part of FAO's comprehensive COVID-19 response package, is a new programme on **Strengthening and extending the One Health approach to avert animal-origin pandemics**. Together with the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE) and the World Health Organization (WHO), FAO promotes the **One Health** approach to prevent the emergence of zoonoses and limit their impact (p. 53). Also, the **Initiative for the Global Control of African swine fever (ASF)**, launched this year by the joint OIE-FAO Global Framework

for the Progressive Control of Transboundary Animal Diseases (GF-TADs) (p. 53), calls to join forces against one of the most devastating diseases affecting pigs across the world today. The livestock sector must shift towards sustainability to ensure animal health and enhance its contribution to the SDGs (p. 53). Challenges and opportunities were discussed in October 2020 during the 27th Session of the Committee on Agriculture (COAG), which saw the establishment of a **Sub-Committee on Livestock**, a significant milestone. ■

Achieving food security for all requires giving vulnerable communities access to adequate **economic opportunities** and **social protection**. FAO provides research and analysis to inform decision-making and help governments mainstream food security into agricultural policy. 
land and resources, and reduce social inequalities.

Migration is a key area. Several titles (pp. 65–66) look at the drivers of migration, assess impacts, and propose alternatives. These include **decent rural employment**, with an emphasis on **youth** – a particularly vulnerable group.

Other titles focus on **gender** (pp. 76–77), from gender mainstreaming in the use of information and communication technologies to women's rights to land.

Preparing for shocks and crises and responding rapidly

when they occur is also crucial to protecting vulnerable communities. This is why FAO issues early warning reports on the food security situation of countries in **emergencies**, and guidance for coping with threats and crises, including through crop diversification and improved access to credit, education, and **social protection**. At the same time, FAO fieldwork aimed at helping people increase their **resilience** and reduce disaster risks is charting a path towards stronger agricultural livelihood systems (71–73). ■



and **health**, in partnership with other key stakeholders. While the COVID-19 pandemic is affecting the daily lives of people around the world, maintaining **healthy diets** (pp. 105–106) is all the more crucial, as a means of supporting a strong immune system.

FAO's publications on nutrition provide guidance to policy makers, programme planners and local practitioners, to ensure that policies, practices and innovations are conducive

to healthy, balanced and sustainable diets, and to help countries scale up **nutrition-sensitive agricultural policies** that support both human and environmental health. These publications cover a wide range of topics, from school feeding programme to food-based dietary guidelines (p. 107). They provide information and access to key data on **food composition** and **food consumption**, needed to inform policies and programmes. ■

Plants are essential for life on earth. We rely on them for 80 percent of the food we eat and 98 percent of the oxygen we breathe. That is why it is essential to redouble efforts to ensure plant health during COVID-19 and to promote sustainable agriculture systems such as conservation agriculture (p. 109), as well as supporting the conservation of plant genetic resources such as farmer's varieties and landraces (p. 34).

pests, and FAO therefore works closely with the World Health Organization on an ongoing basis to set standards and codes of conduct for pesticide use. This work is reflected in a number of annual publications (p. 110–111).






