Objective

To strengthen preparedness and mitigate the impacts of flooding and typhoons on vulnerable fishing households and fisherfolk associations.

Activities implemented

- Distributed anticipatory cash assistance worth USD 54 948 to 964 vulnerable households in Isabela ahead of Typhoon Toraji.
- Distributed community cash grants worth USD 14 104 and protective gear for 283 boats to 639 households from fisherfolk associations in Catanduanes ahead of Super Typhoon Man-yi.
- Distributed USD 128 429 to 4 413 households and engaged them in simulation exercises in Surigao del Norte.

Results

- Enabled 964 households in Isabela to meet immediate food, supplemental irrigation and education-related needs, while preventing further deterioration of livelihoods.
- Enabled 639 households to protect their livelihoods by evacuating their boats following the protocol activation for Super Typhoon Man-yi.
- Raised the awareness of 4 413 households and improved their preparedness on anticipatory action; along with strengthening the operational readiness of local government units and testing early warning protocols.
