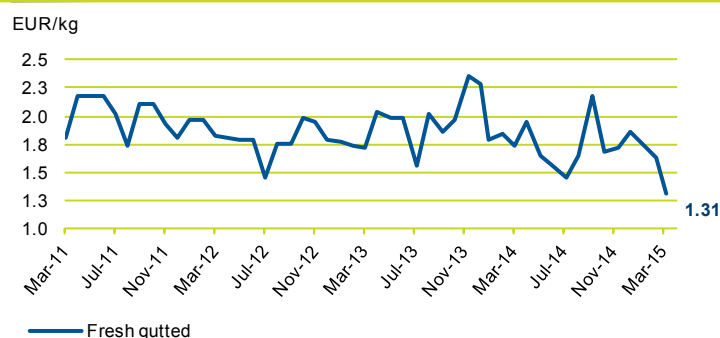
LATEST TRENDS

The Lent season and, in particular, Holy Week just before Easter, are still the top fish consuming periods in Catholic countries. Demand on the European market is reported to be strong, as the final shipments are being prepared to meet higher consumption in the weeks before Easter. The depreciation of the Euro against the dollar has had no immediate impact on price levels. After Easter, demand is expected to weaken, and prices are expected to decline. This trend is reflected in the current issue of the European Price Report, in which we can observe price declines for the majority of species, while prices increased for only three species.

GROUNDFISH

In general, **groundfish** catches have been slow, due to the weather conditions in the Northern hemisphere. In **Spain**, reports suggest prices for groundfish species have been rising, in particular for wet salted product which is the main ingredient for the traditional dishes to be consumed during the Lenten period and in the last week before Easter (Semana Santa).

COD - in Poland (FOB, origin: Baltic Sea)



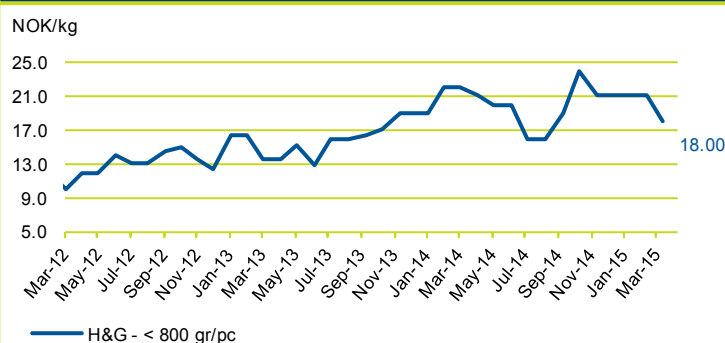
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The **European Fish Price Report**, based on information supplied by industry correspondents, aims to provide guidance on broad price trends. Price information is indicative and should be used only for forecasting medium- and long-term trends. FAO is not responsible for any errors or omissions.

The new **Alaska pollack** season is just about to start and traders are waiting to assess whether the fishing will be good. Currently, there is some indication of good supply of Alaska pollack on the market and lower prices. Traders are already selling the 2015 Alaska pollack catch on the **Russian** market at far reduced prices. The first arrivals from the new catch are expected to hit the market next week which will lead to a drop in price. No stocks of **saithe** are available at the moment, as catches have not started yet and prices are even higher than during the previous month.

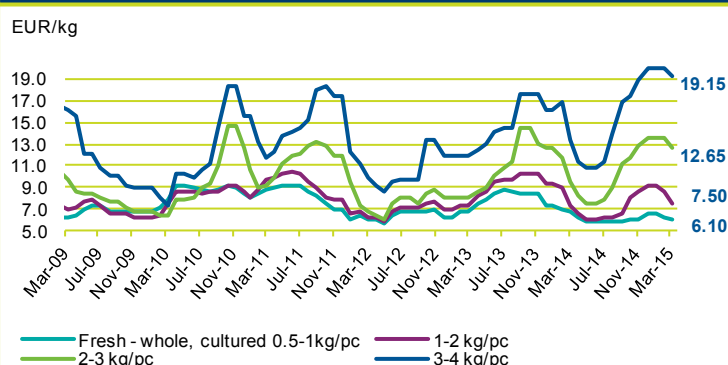
HADDOCK - H&G, origin: Norway



FLATFISH

Demand for **turbot** remained stable at low levels while farms reported good growth, leading to a drop in prices. Seawater conditions seem to be suitable, likely to result in good growth of cultured turbot in Spain over the next month – this should see prices continue to fall. Catches of wild flatfish such as turbot and **European sole** have just started again after the winter break, and arrivals on the Southern European market are being sold at lower prices than at the end of the season last year. Further declines in prices are likely after Easter.

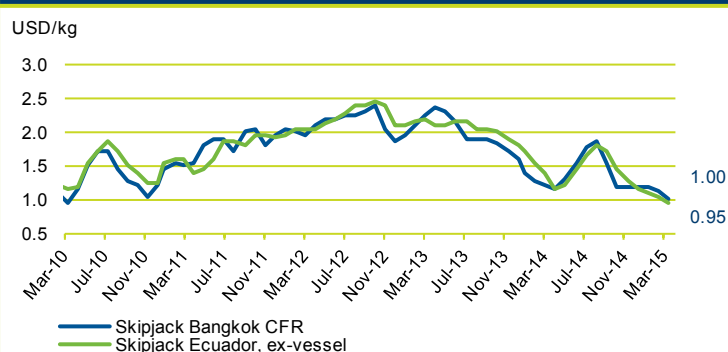
TURBOT - in Spain, origin: Spain



TUNA - BILLFISHES

Fishing for tuna in the **Western and Central Pacific** remains moderate and the skipjack price has continued its decline to the USD 1000/tonne CFR level, which is a psychological border line. One has to go as far back as November 2009 to find a skipjack price below this level. Even at this lower level, buyers are hesitant to place large orders. Thai Canneries have reported low production activity while raw material inventories remain at

TUNA - Pacific Ocean



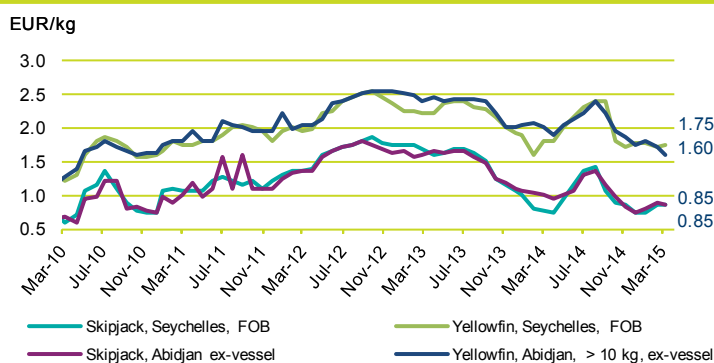
moderate-to-high levels. Fishing is improving slightly in the **Indian Ocean** and local canneries have reported that they are sufficiently stocked at the moment.

The ICCAT FAD closure in the **Atlantic Ocean** ended on 28 February 2015. This, together with favourable weather conditions, has led to improved fishing, with a majority of yellowfin being landed. Both skipjack and yellowfin prices decreased as a result of good fishing and limited demand from the canneries.

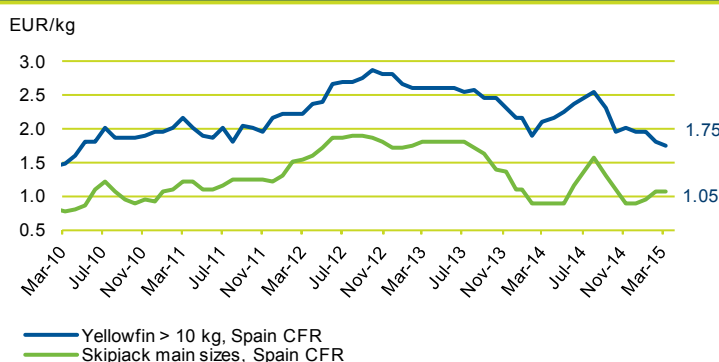
Catches in the **Eastern Pacific** have also improved, with mainly skipjack being landed. Local canneries continue to report healthy inventories. Similarly to Thai Canneries, the local canneries are reporting low factory activity.

As the supply from the Atlantic and Indian Oceans improves, the **European** market for skipjack has remained stable while yellowfin has been selling at lower levels, both for loins and for whole fish.

SMALL PELAGICS

Small pelagic catches were slow in the first quarter, a normal seasonal feature. **Mackerel** prices increased somewhat with most of the available quantity booked and therefore not available for free negotiations. New season mackerel are starting to be offered, which means last year's catch is now being sold at a discount. Overall the small pelagic market looks quite stable, with good fishing quotas in Northern Europe.

CEPHALOPODS

Spanish traders are hesitant to buy **giant squid** which is traded in dollars, awaiting a stronger Euro. At the moment the price of giant squid is too high to be used in the normal preparations from this product (preformed squid rings), generally directed to the lower price bracket of restaurants and supermarkets. In response to this reluctance to buy, **Peruvian** and **Chilean** exporters have reduced their offers as expressed in dollars. For the rest of the cephalopod market, demand and prices are stable.

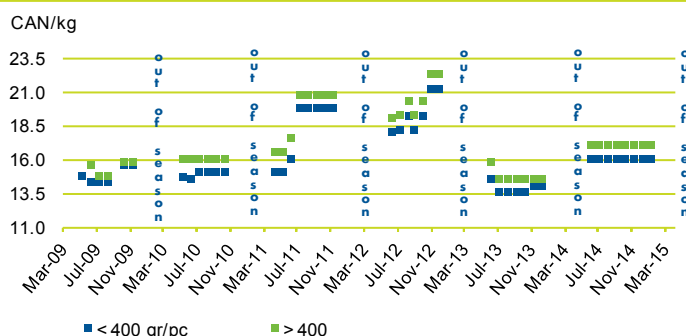
CRUSTACEANS

Crab prices are high due to the end of the fishing season and lower stocks.

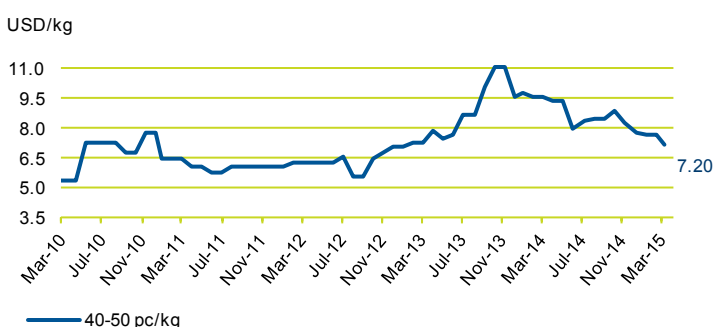
Lobster prices remain relatively firm, with strong demand in the main markets and no supply arriving from **Canada**, where the season is yet to start. There are only a few fishing zones open in Canada during winter (around south Nova Scotia). Practically everything is directed to the live market, but the low winter temperatures mean lobsters hardly move on the bottom of the ocean, leading to low catches and sky high prices for live lobster. The big spring season in the Gulf of Saint Lawrence starts on 1 May, when all the lobster producers will start up their factories again. If the winter is long and the water stays cold, the start of the season could be slow. Canada accounts for about one third of EU lobster imports in quantity terms.

Argentine red shrimp prices are going down, as exporters in Argentina still have substantial stocks of the product and the new fishing season is just about to start. The expectation is for temporary improvement during Semana Santa. However, following the festive period, shrimp prices for all types and species are likely to decline in view of the strong production forecast for **Indonesia**, **India** and **China**. This downward trend is likely to continue well into summer.

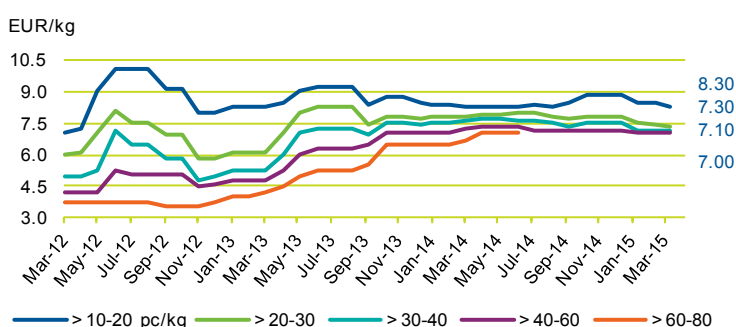
AMERICAN LOBSTER - in Europe, origin: Canada

ARGENTINA RED SHRIMP - origin: Argentina

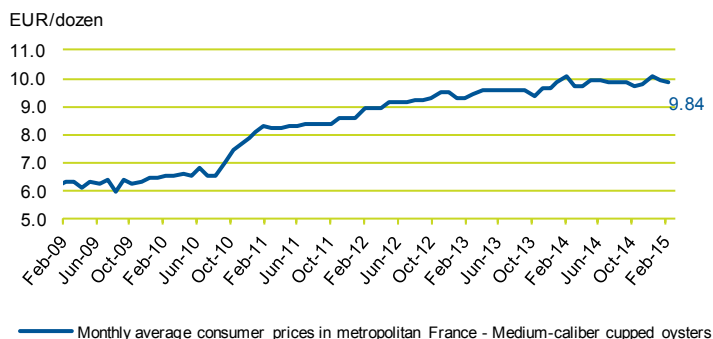


BIVALVES

It is mainly Irish and Dutch **mussels** present on the French market in March. Spanish galloprovincialis also available as a low price option.

Large-sized **oysters** are more abundant this year due to a warmer autumn and the lack of exports to Russia which is a traditional market for large sizes n°1 and no2. This has led to a slight easing of prices in early 2015. At retail level, however, prices appear to be reasonably stable.

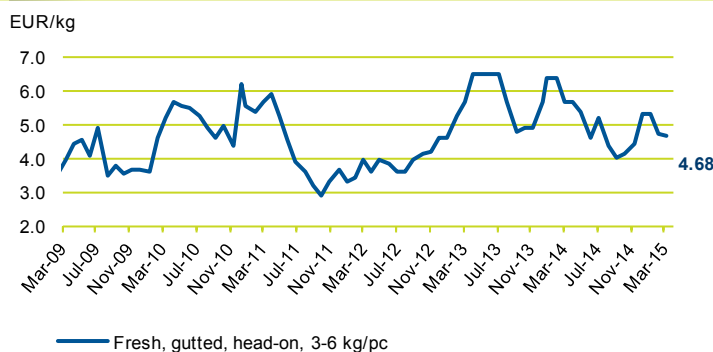
OYSTER - in France - Source Insee



SALMON

According to figures from the Norwegian Seafood Council (NSC), **Norwegian** exporters sold 11% more **salmon** in February this year compared with the same month in 2014. Prices so far this year, however, have remained stable somewhat below last year's level, due to a combination of increased supply volumes, the continuing absence of the Russian market and a stronger Kroner. The EU market absorbed some 7% more salmon in February in terms of value, at NOK 2.3 billion. The major growth markets for Norwegian salmon, however, are the US and Asian markets, registering 27% and 28% increases in value respectively and compensating to an extent for the large drop in exports to Eastern Europe.

The **Scottish** salmon industry, meanwhile, saw almost 11% growth in total export volume in 2014 on the back of strong demand from the USA, France and China, although lower prices meant the corresponding increase in value was only 7%. Higher sea temperatures this year are compounding sea lice problems for the European industry and pushing up costs. At the North Atlantic Seafood Forum in Bergen this month, various possible solutions were discussed, ranging from cleaner wrasse stocking to offshore pens. Together with increasing fishmeal prices, this situation has also fuelled the debate as to the viability of land-based salmon farms, although many people in the industry remain skeptical. In the shorter term, price expectations have been revised downwards recently, with forecasts for the remainder of 2015 now hovering around NOK 40 per kg for whole fresh Atlantic salmon.

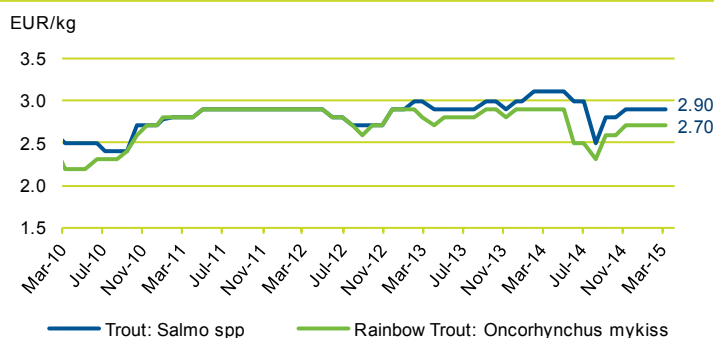
TROUT

The export market for **Norwegian trout** is currently enduring a difficult period following the loss of the major Russian market, and total export value for February this year was

27% less than the same month last year at NOK 145 million, according to the NSC. The drop in total volume was less at 21%, reflecting an 18% drop in prices.

The trout market in **Italy** is reported to be not very active, with reduced prices. In view of the increased production costs for trout and aquaculture products in general, the present trout price is not sustainable and many producers might have to leave the market.

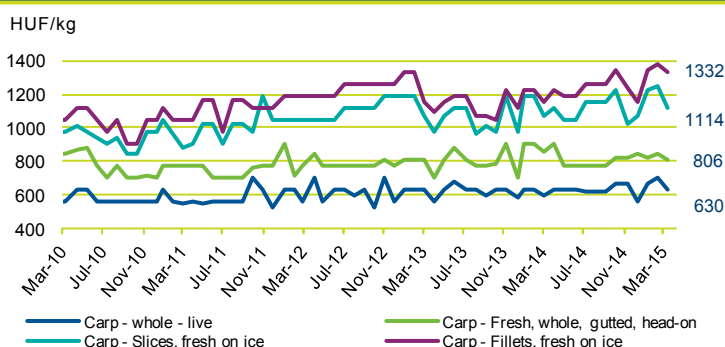
TROUT - Ex-farm prices in Italy



FRESHWATER FISH

Lent season is a strong selling period for freshwater fish in landlocked countries or regions with Catholic traditions. **Carp** is a very traditional fish product for the Lent season. **Tilapia** has now also become part of this tradition and prices are expected to pick up during the next weeks in the lead up to Easter.

CARP - in Europe, origin: Hungary

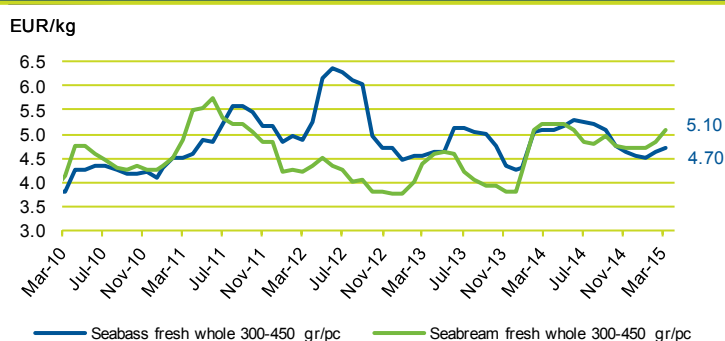


SEABASS - SEABREAM - MEAGRE

Full year figures for **Turkish bass** and **breem** exports paint a very positive picture for the industry with value up by some 65% in Turkish Lira terms, volume up by some 26% and the average price for fresh bass and bream up by 29% and 33% respectively.

Greek exporters, meanwhile, saw a drop in volume of around 8%, with prices up 14% for fresh whole bream and down 5% for fresh whole bass. In general, the outlook for the European bass and bream industry in 2015 is positive, as the projected decrease in harvest volumes should see a corresponding price increase. Indeed, March prices for Greek fish on the Italian market are substantially above those for the same month last year, particularly in the case of bream.
